City Council Approves New 'Gamechanger' Housing Strategy

Calgarians now have a clearer idea of what a housing strategy for the city will look like for the next six years.

City counsil vote 12-3 in favout of a new plan for housing Saturday night, after a marathon three-day committeemeeting where 162 residents shared their concerns about the city's housing crisis.

The strategy, adopted with amendments, includes an incentive program to create new secondary suites, plans to dispose of city land for new housing units and adopting new zoning rules to allow row houses and duplexes anywhere in the city.

It's intended to help Calgary move toward increasing the supply of market and non-market housing in order to meet demand and improve affordability.

"This is the permission to solve the problem, that's what we did here today," said Ward 8 Coun. Courtney Walcott.

"Administration has it, council has given it, the punblic can expect it from us. It's a big change."

Amendments made to the strategy call for the city to find two parcels of land which can be used for pre-fabricated housing to help families facing homelessness this winter.

The city also plans to invest \$25 million into postsecondary student housing.

In approving the strategy, Walcott said, the city can now begin attacking the housing crisis which has left many people scrambling to find a place to live or struggling to afford to keep a roof over their head.

Alberta Minister of Jobs, Economy and Trade Matt Jones will travel to Japan to promote the province as a strong trade partner and investment environment.



- Alberta is forecast to have country-leading provincial GDP growth of 2.2% in 2023

the foothills along the shores of
the Bow River, it also provides
some of Alberta's most scenic
vistas. But that's not all. It's also
become one of the country's
biggest tech hubs.

In February, Garmin Canada Inc., headquartered in Cochrane, announced a major expansion to its offices, paving the way for 200 new STEM jobs.

"It means great things for Cochrane," says Cochrane Mayor Jeff Genung.

He says the Garmin expansion story garnered worldwide attention.

"People are watching. I think that it will only be a matter of time and we will see some complementary tech companies wanting to situate themselves here in Cochrane. The real job for us as a council and as a community is to ensure that we have land use in place and that we have the space available

and policies in place that will streamline the process when they come online."

Currently, Cochrane's population sits at around 35,000 and is the fastest growing municipality in Alberta. It doesn't appear to be slowing.

"Cochrane is an extremely attractive place to live and work — it's got the natural environment, the proximity to the mountains and to the city of Calgary. It's all location, location, location," says Genung.

Calgary home sales at record highs in September, yet supply remains a challenge



Sales reached another record high in September with 2,441 sales. Despite the year-over-year gains reported over the past four months, year-to-date sales are still nearly 12 per cent lower than last year's levels.

New listings also improved this month compared to last year and relative to sales. This caused the salesto-new listings ratio to fall to 76 per cent, preventing further monthly declines in inventory levels.

Nonetheless, inventory levels in September remained over 24 per cent lower than levels seen last year and when measured relative to sales activity, has not changed enough to cause any significant shift in supply and demand balances. As of September, the months of supply has remained relatively low at less than two months.

Final Section of Calgary's ring road opens to traffic on Tuesday

The final section of Calgary's ring road is set to open to traffic on Tuesday, marking the completion of the 101-kilometre freeway several months ahead of schedule, officials announced Monday.

The West Calgary section of the ring road runs from Highway 8 to the Trans-Canada Highway, covering nine kilometres of six- and eight-lane divided highway, with six interchanges and 24 bridges.

"Calgary's ring road is a project that has been decades in the making and its completion is a real cause for celebration," Premier Danielle Smith said in a release.
